Alfred Z. Abuhamad

Professor Abuhamad currently serves as Professor and Chairman for the Department of Obstetrics and Gynecology, Vice Dean for Clinical Affairs and Director of the Maternal-Fetal Medicine Fellowship Program at Eastern Virginia Medical School. Dr. Abuhamad is the immediate past President of the Society of Maternal-Fetal Medicine. He is the immediate past Chair of the Council for Patient Safety in Women's Health Care, and the past President of the American Institute of Ultrasound in Medicine. He has published more than 170 peer-reviewed manuscripts, received numerous national awards and has authored six text books in fetal echocardiography, ultrasound in Obstetrics and Gynecology, first trimester ultrasound and office procedures. He is the recipient of the National Institute of Health R01 grant to study Novel Tools for the Non-Invasive Evaluation of the Human Placenta. Dr. Abuhamad established the International Society of Obstetrics and Gynecology Outreach Program and has led several ultrasound training missions to the developing world to include Haiti, Ghana and Somaliland. He is well known internationally for his work in ultrasound, prenatal diagnosis, fetal echocardiography, global outreach and patient safety.





Katia M. Bilardo

Caterina (Katia) M. Bilardo was born in Savigliano (Piedmont), Italy. After completing her medical studies cum laude in 1983, and specializing in Obstetrics and Gynaecology at the University of Turin, she trained as a Fellow in Prenatal Diagnosis and Fetal Medicine at King's College Hospital, London (1985- 1989), where she worked under the supervision of Prof. S. Campbell and Prof. K. N. Nicolaides. In 1989 she returned to the Netherlands as a Consultant and Head of the Prenatal Diagnosis Department at the Academic Medical Center in Amsterdam (1992-2010). In 1994, she defended her PhD thesis at the University of Groningen. From 2010 to 2017 she worked as Head of the Fetal Medicine Department at the University Medical Center Groningen where, in 2011, she was appointed as Professor in Fetal Medicine. In October 2017 she relocated to the VU Medical Center in Amsterdam where she serves as Head of the Fetal Medicine Department and has also been appointed as Professor in Fetal Medicine. She has served as President of the Dutch Working Party for Ultrasound in Obstetrics and Gynecology, and is currently a member of the Committee on Prenatal Screening at the National Health Council. She is also the current Director of the Prenatal Screening Association North – East Netherlands. Since 2007, Professor Bilardo has been serving on the Editorial Board of Ultrasound in Obstetrics and Gynecology. Since 2009, she has been a Board Member of the International Society of Ultrasound in Obstetrics and Gynecology (ISUOG) and is the President-Elect. She is the immediate past-chair of Education Committee. Her areas of interest include Doppler study of the utero-placental and fetal circulation (chief researcher Truffle study); fetal dysmorphology (2D and 3D studies); first and second trimester ultrasound screening for aneuploidies; first trimester ultrasound and psychological aspects of screening and fetal cardiology. She has published over 160 peer-reviewed articles and has supervised numerous PhD students.



Gerard H. A. Visser

Professor Visser is an Emeritus Professor of Obstetrics and he is the former Head of the department at the University Medical Center, Utrecht in the Netherlands. He is the current chair of the FIGO Committee for Safe Motherhood and Newborn Health. Professor Visser is the former President of the European Association of Perinatal Medicine, he is an Honorary Fellow of the Flemish, South African, Royal (British; fellow ad eudem) and Romanian Colleges of Obstetrics & Gynecology and of the German Perinatal Society. He was awarded the Maternity Prize of the European Association of Perinatal Medicine in 2016. Professor Visser's research interests include: fetal (neurological) development, fetal monitoring, IUGR, diabetes and pregnancy. He has authored over 460 PubMed articles, which have been cited over 23000 times according to Google Scholar. In addition, he has supervised 72 completed PhD projects.

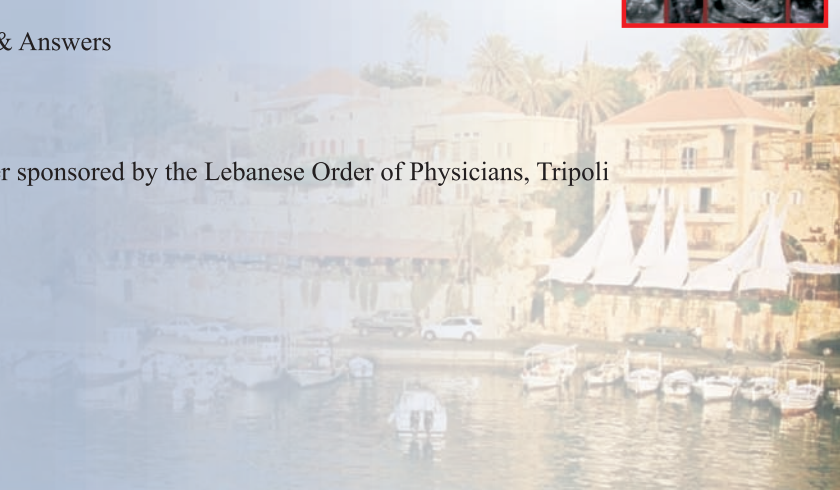

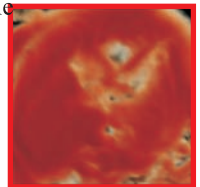
